Sleeping and living down by the river, people who are deprived of adequate housing know what it means to be oppressed. Their old discarded-by-others tents are often covered in layers of tarps and old blankets, and the floors are lined with layers of cardboard. Many of our community members have shared with us that during these cold months, they are faced with the grim reality of having to choose between freezing to death and risking their lives and/or their belongings by lighting a candle or some other heat source inside their shelters at night.

Advent is a time when we are reminded of our need for such things as hope, peace, joy, and love. The world needs these things. The world is desperately longing for these things, especially among those who experience oppression.



Two Sundays ago, at Sanctuary, we lit the peace candle. We shared together about how badly the world needs peace. And we spoke about how one of the best ways we could contribute to global peace was by being intentional about being peacemakers right here in our own communities.

Our Sunday evening community has grown recently. We've got our regular crew, but more and more often we have folks from down by the river coming to join us. Perhaps they are just looking for a warm and dry space to be for a couple of hours, often sitting on the periphery of our circle. We are deeply humbled and honoured to have them. We closed our service that week by asking everyone to stand, and to turn to their right and to their left, and greet one another by saying "peace be with you". We call this act Passing the Peace. It is not a practice we have done very often in this space, but it quickly became a sacred moment. For the next 5-10 minutes, community members crossed the circle, some left the circle, and others entered the circle to greet one another with handshakes, fistbumps, and hugs as they passed the peace to one another.

This holiday season, whatever your faith or non-faith background is, regardless of your culture, beliefs, or commitments, we urge you to take the side of hope, of peace, of joy, and of love.

Peace be with us all.
